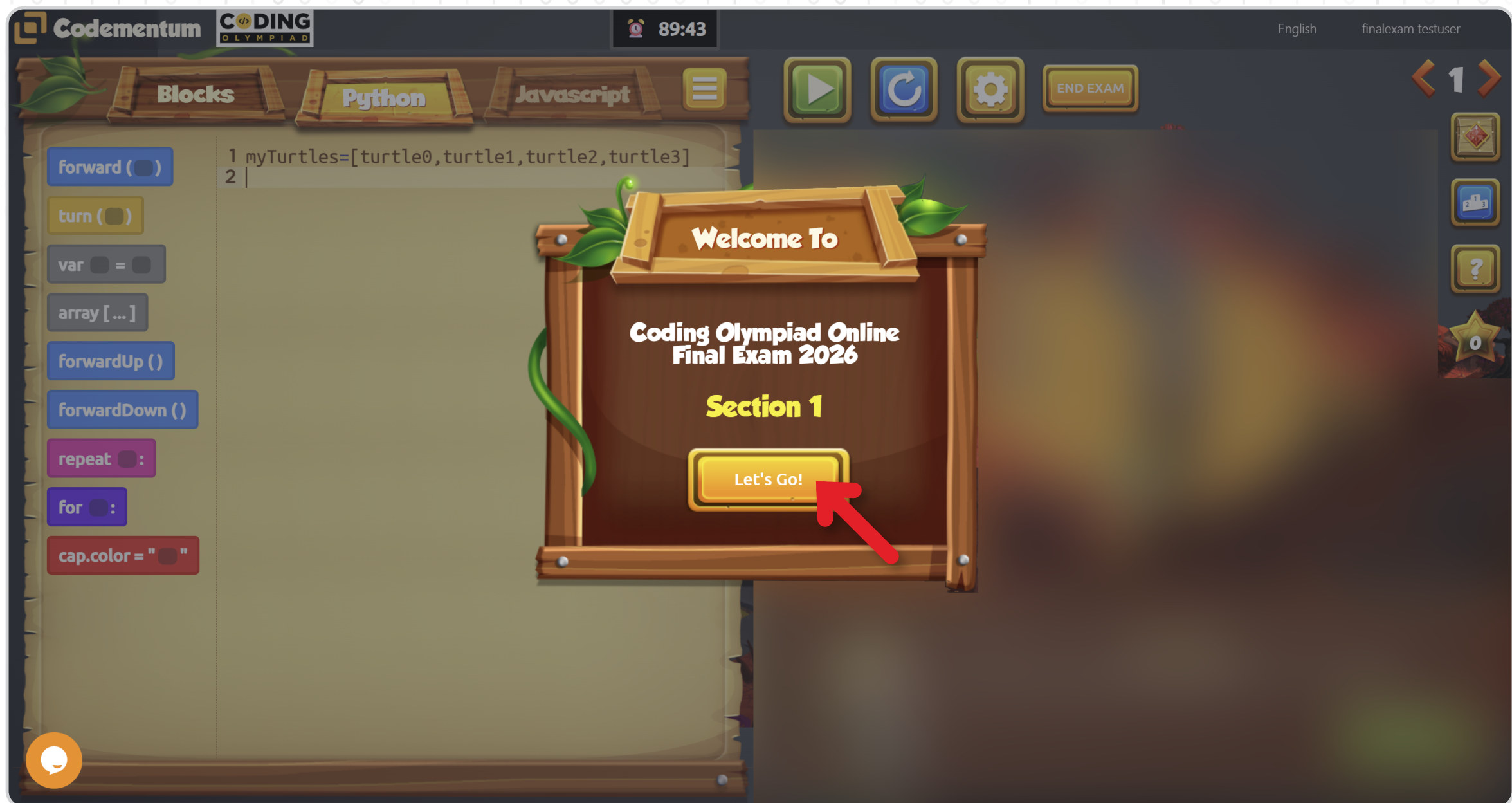

When you reach the Codementum screen, it means your exam has started.

You can start solving the challenges by clicking the “Let’s Go!” button.

From this point on, you cannot pause or stop the exam.



## **Exam Submission:**

**If you have completed your exam, click the END EXAM button immediately to submit it. Remember, time spent is a key factor in case of a tie in scores. When your 90 minutes are up, the exam time will be over, and it will close automatically. Your solutions will be saved.**

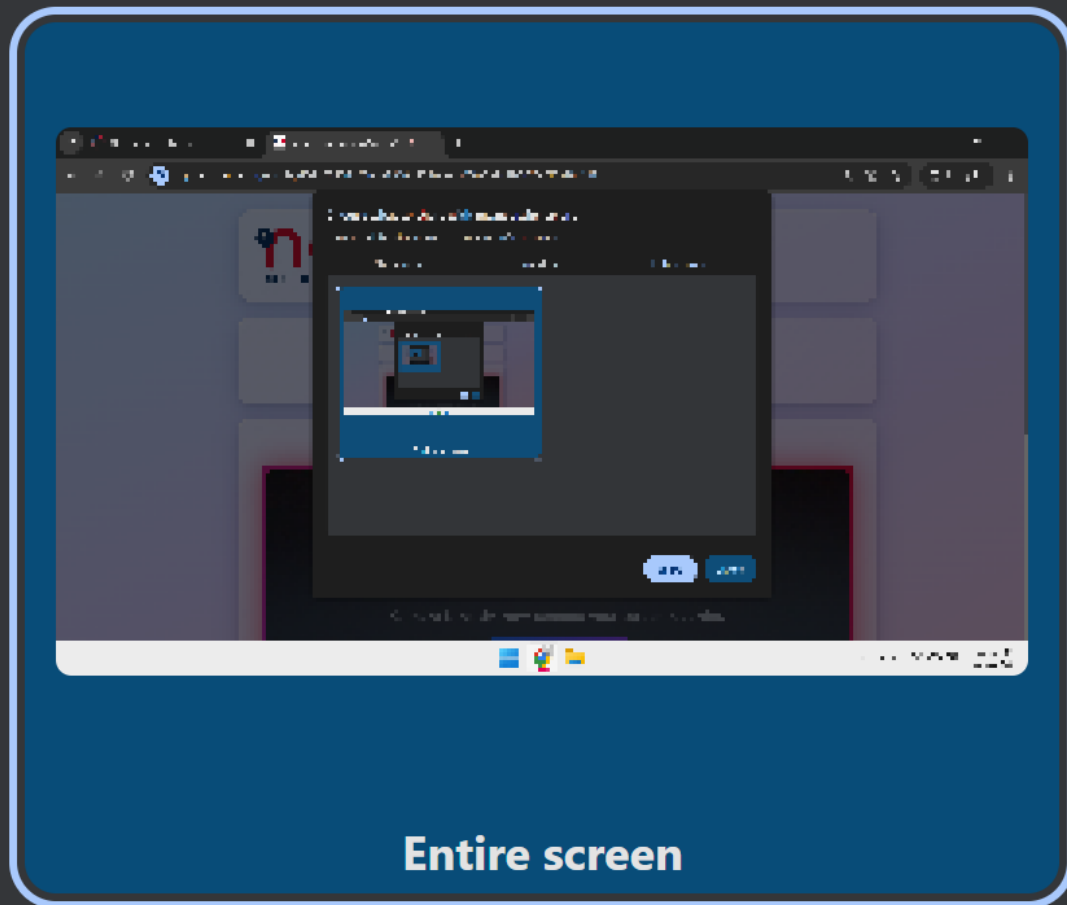

## Camera and Screen Sharing

Before connecting to the exam, you must activate your camera and share your entire screen. The Coding Olympiad exam portal has a camera program that you can synchronize with your device's camera. Participants will be monitored by the Coding Olympiad team via a camera program.



**Warning:**

Students in the top 10 who do not have camera recording and screen sharing will definitely not be eligible for the top 10. No objections will be accepted on this matter.



## How Scoring Works

- 30% of the highest score from the qualification exams will be carried over to the final exam.
- 70% of the final exam score will be considered.

Students who missed the qualification exams can also take the final exam. Their scores will be calculated based solely on the final exam, out of 70 points.



## **Main Evaluation Criteria (in order)**

**Completed challenges, stars (points), time spent, camera, and screen sharing:**

- **Students without a camera and screen sharing cannot be in the top 10.**
- **In case of a tie in points, students with camera and screen sharing will rank higher.**



## **Tips for Success**

### **30th Challenge: Additional Actions Required**

**Unlike previous challenges, the 30th challenge requires both coding and active on-screen interaction. After completing your code and clicking the Run button, you must click on the obstacles using your mouse to assist the code in executing successfully.**



## Tips for Success

- Plan your time wisely. If you get stuck, skip the challenge and come back later.
- Read carefully. Understand what the problem is asking before you start coding.
- Focus on accuracy and logic, not just speed. Each complete and correct solution matters most.
- Use Block0 Mode when needed. It's great for visualizing complex logic or debugging step-by-step.
- Keep your code clean. Simpler code is easier to debug and runs more efficiently.



## **EXAM RESULTS**

**The exam results will be announced within 12 days at the latest. After this date, you will be able to download your report from your CODING Olympiad student panel.**

- **The exam will be available only at the scheduled time and will not be accessible for 24 hours as in previous exams.**
- **The exam will begin at 10:00 AM; late arrivals will not receive additional time.**
- **The exam will be held on 29 March 2026 only and cannot be rescheduled**
